
PUBLIC OPINION SURVEY FINDINGS

The results of the public opinion survey CeSID conducted within the Programme "PRO-Local Governance for People and Nature" in 50 cities and municipalities in Serbia show that one out of two Serbian citizens are satisfied with the services extended by local self-governments. They are satisfied the most with the work of the general administration service and the administration.

One out of five respondents list lack of information about the procedures and documentation they need in order to exercise their rights and the complexity of the procedures they have to undergo among the greatest obstacles to their communication with city/municipal administrations.

The survey results show an increase in the number of citizens satisfied with various aspects of the public officials' work.

The respondents are also satisfied with the state of the green markets, the quality of educational institutions, the availability of sports and recreational facilities and safety.

The other elements the respondents are dissatisfied with include the state of urbanism, equal exercise of rights, youth policies and opportunities for youth.

In addition to gauging their satisfaction with the work of the local self-governments and perceptions of the quality of their lives, the survey respondents were asked to share their views on the impact of civil society organisations on their local communities.

Low direct public participation in decision-making persists, with 73% of the respondents saying that the **local authorities rarely ask them** what they thought of their decisions. A third of the respondents say that their city/municipality did not discuss the local budget with them over the past two years.

The respondents mainly familiarised themselves with the work of their local governments via **local TV stations** (41%) and **local Internet portals and websites** (38%).
